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# Author's Note

As the Author and Executive Director of BANCAT, I share this message with deep humility and purpose, driven by our mission to transform cancer care in Bangladesh. Our goal is to support those battling cancer and address systemic gaps in early detection, timely treatment, and holistic care.

Cancer is a growing crisis in Bangladesh, affecting nearly every family. With an annual increase of 5% and approximately 2.5 million patients, awareness remains low, diagnoses are delayed, and access to treatment is limited, especially for the underserved. Even the affluent often neglect the urgency of cancer due to fear and ignorance. The country's healthcare infrastructure struggles to meet rising demand, widening the gap in cancer care, particularly in low- and middle-income communities. Bridging this gap requires collaboration among governments, healthcare providers, and communities to improve early detection, affordable treatment, and comprehensive care.

Palliative care improves the quality of life for those facing serious illnesses like cancer, heart disease, and Parkinson's. Unlike standard treatments that focus on curing the disease, palliative care addresses physical, emotional, and psychological challenges.

By providing symptom relief and emotional support through a multidisciplinary team, palliative care ensures patients receive dignified, compassionate care. It offers "realistic hope," empowering patients to spend quality time with loved ones, free from unnecessary suffering. Hospice care further provides comfort in end-of-life stages.

My commitment to cancer care began with visits to public hospitals, where I witnessed patients arriving in advanced stages, often beyond treatment. The need for greater awareness, early detection, and accessible care became clear.

I met families sacrificing everything for treatment, facing financial hardship and societal stigma. This drove me to provide direct financial support, prioritizing cases based on urgency and need. Over five years, these efforts highlighted deeper flaws in the healthcare system.

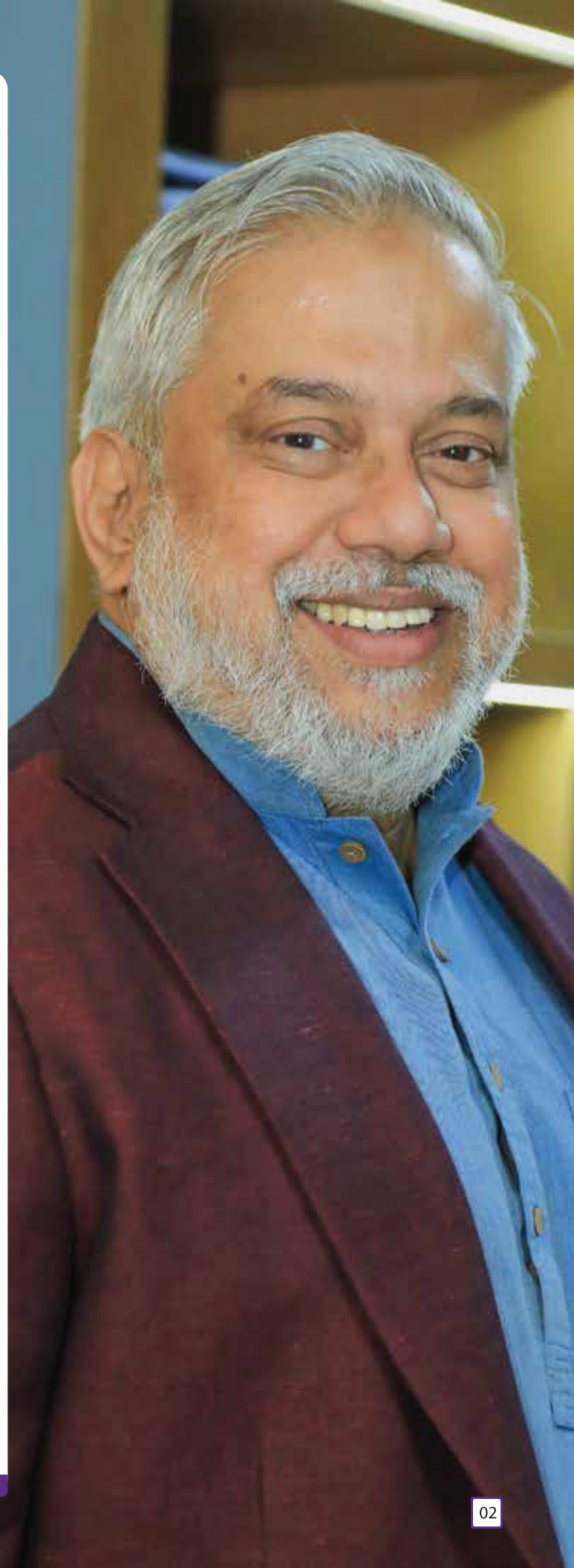
My battle with cancer reinforced my resolve to bridge the "Cancer Care Gap" in Bangladesh. I restructured BANCAT, built a passionate team, and formed partnerships to revolutionize cancer care. This effort led to Mosabbir Alok Nibash, a pioneering initiative redefining cancer care. More than a facility, it is a sanctuary of hope, rooted in our "Care is Cure" philosophy, extending recovery beyond treatment to psychological well-being, nutrition, and socio-economic empowerment.

At Mosabbir Alok Nibash, we offer comprehensive services, ensuring dignity, support, and a nurturing community for cancer warriors and their families. Our vision extends beyond Bangladesh. Through strategic partnerships, we aim to replicate the Mosabbir Alok Nibash model globally, ensuring no one fights cancer alone.

# Our Story



BANCAT's journey is one of unwavering determination, inspired by its founder, Najmus Ahmed Albab. Diagnosed with cancer in 2011, he turned his personal battle into a mission to support others facing similar struggles. His resilience led to the creation of the "I Beat Cancer" initiative, which quickly became a symbol of hope across Bangladesh.

Realizing the need for comprehensive cancer support, Najmus Ahmed Albab, along with 29 dedicated supporters, established the Bangladesh Cancer Aid Foundation (BANCAF) in 2015. Over the years, BANCAF provided rehabilitation and financial aid to nearly 300 cancer patients, working in collaboration with donors, sponsors, and compassionate individuals.

In July 2019, BANCAF transitioned into BANCAT, marking a new chapter in its mission. With a team of 15, the organization intensified its fight against cancer, expanding outreach and assistance. Even during the challenges of the COVID-19 pandemic, BANCAT distributed 3,000 food aid packages to hospitals and provided critical support to cancer patients and their families.

Cancer statistics in Bangladesh in 2021 highlighted an urgent need for action. That year alone, 1,50,071 new cancer cases were diagnosed, with 1,08,138 lives lost. Women accounted for 59.5% of all cases, often being diagnosed at a younger age than men. Among women, breast and cervical cancers

remained the most prevalent, while men suffered significantly from urinary bladder, prostate, and oral cancers. A substantial number of cases were among adults, with a notable portion affecting children. Recognizing the need for holistic care, BANCAT achieved a major milestone in 2022 with the establishment of Alok Nibash, a dedicated cancer care home. Initially launched with 24 beds, the facility provided free accommodation, food, transportation, and emotional support to approximately 350 patients in its first year. In partnership with the Mosabbir Memorial Foundation, Alok Nibash later expanded to 85 beds, strengthening BANCAT's commitment to comprehensive patient care.

Beyond treatment, BANCAT has become a leading force in cancer awareness and advocacy in Bangladesh. Through youth-led campaigns, educational programs, and collaborations with corporate organizations, hospitals, and NGOs, the organization continues to foster a culture of awareness and support. Additional initiatives, including winter aid distributions and awareness events, further extend BANCAT's impact across communities.

Today, BANCAT stands as a living testament to Najmus Ahmed Albab's vision. Through every act of care, advocacy, and support, the organization remains committed to transforming lives and ensuring that no one faces cancer alone.

It ensures that cancer warriors, especially those from vulnerable backgrounds, have access to safe, inclusive, and sustainable living conditions, reinforcing the importance of accessible healthcare and urban inclusivity.

Alok Katha aligns with SDG 13 (Climate Action) by incorporating eco-friendly and repurposed packaging, reducing textile waste, and promoting sustainable handicrafts. Upcycling materials and embracing ethical production, it minimizes environmental impact while fostering a circular economy. Additionally, its workshops educate cancer patients and caregivers on sustainable practices, encouraging eco-conscious creativity. Through these efforts, Alok Katha not only supports mental well-being and economic empowerment but also contributes to a healthier planet, reinforcing its commitment to both people and the environment.

Established in 2004 in memory of Mosabbir Hossain Khan, a 17-year-old who lost his battle with cancer, MCCC has now merged with Alok Nibash, founded three years ago, to create Mosabbir Alok Nibash—a dedicated initiative committed to comprehensive cancer support.

Mosabbir Alok Nibash ensures access to free medical treatment, accommodation, mental health support, nutrition guidance, and wellness training for cancer patients and caregivers as well. More than 100 patients and their families derive benefit from these services, which are aimed at giving them dignity and comfort during their most challenging times. The initiative extends beyond immediate care, working to raise awareness about cancer prevention and early detection while laying the foundation for a state-of-the-art cancer care village to be equipped with modern treatment facilities.

This year will focus on expanding home care services, ensuring that terminal and long-term cancer patients receive quality medical attention within the comfort of their homes. Financial aid programs will be strengthened to assist underserved patients in accessing life-saving treatments, covering everything from chemotherapy and radiotherapy to essential medications.

Emotional and psychological support will be a crucial pillar of this initiative. BANCAT will introduce specialized mental health counseling for patients and their families, addressing the anxiety, depression, and emotional distress that often accompany a cancer diagnosis. Community-driven initiatives, including caregiver training and volunteer engagement programs, will be scaled up to build a robust support system around patients.

Recognizing this critical gap, BANCAT has introduced the Alok Boshoti project—an ambitious initiative to establish upto 250-bed capacity care village, providing nationwide hospice and palliative care services. This first-of-its-kind facility is dedicated to offering holistic and compassionate support, particularly for cancer patients.

### A Vision for Dignified Care

Alok Boshoti is more than just a hospice; it represents a movement towards ensuring that cancer patients receive the dignity and care they deserve. Guided by BANCAT's philosophy, 'Care is Cure,' this initiative aims to create a national model for palliative care that addresses existing gaps in Bangladesh's healthcare system. Beyond medical treatment, the facility will offer mental health counseling, spiritual support, and community engagement to provide a comprehensive healing experience for both patients and their families.

### Bridging the Gaps in Cancer Care

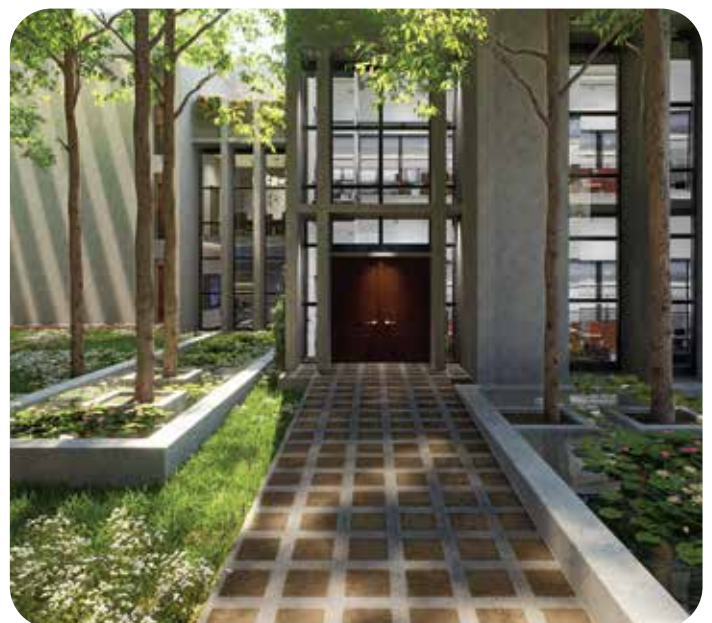
In Bangladesh, cancer patients and their caregivers face immense emotional, financial, and logistical challenges. With fewer than 1% of patients having access to proper palliative care, many endure unnecessary suffering due to a lack of medical, psychological, and spiritual support. Alok Boshoti seeks to address these deficiencies by providing accessible, holistic care, especially in underserved regions. The facility will offer mental health counseling, spiritual guidance, and training for family members to help them support their loved ones. Additionally, public awareness campaigns will work towards changing societal attitudes about hospice care and end-of-life treatment.





## A Holistic Approach to Patient Care

Alok Boshoti will be equipped with up to 250 inpatient beds dedicated solely to end-of-life care. The facility will also operate free cancer screening clinics to serve rural and underserved communities, helping to detect cancer in its early stages. The design of the hospice will emphasize sustainability, with renewable energy systems and on-site organic farming to provide nutritious meals for patients. Alongside these practical solutions, the facility will offer mental wellness programs such as counseling, therapeutic activities, and community engagement, ensuring that patients are supported emotionally and spiritually as well as physically. Specialized healthcare training will be provided to professionals in palliative care, helping to foster a cadre of skilled individuals dedicated to providing the highest standard of care.





## **Building a Sustainable, Community-Centered Facility**

BANCAT envisions Alok Boshoti as a self-sustaining ecosystem that balances patient care with environmental responsibility. The facility will be powered by solar energy, reducing its reliance on traditional energy sources. Water conservation systems will be implemented to minimize resource waste, while on-site organic farming will supply nutritious meals for the patients. The facility will also adopt recycling initiatives to promote environmental sustainability, ensuring that its operations have minimal negative impact on the environment.

### **Phased Implementation Plan**

Alok Boshoti project will be carried out in five phases to ensure that it progresses smoothly and efficiently. The first phase, spanning three months, will focus on finalizing architectural designs, securing permits, and forming partnerships. The second phase, from four to nine months, will be dedicated to fundraising and resource mobilization, where BANCAT will engage donors, launch campaigns, and secure sponsorships. The construction phase will take place from months ten to thirty-four, during which the hospice facility and its sustainable infrastructure will be built. The final phases will focus on recruitment and training, culminating in the official launch of the facility, expected to open its doors to patients within 37 months.



### Anticipated Impact and Future Goals

Upon completion, Alok Boshoti is expected to make a profound impact on the cancer care landscape in Bangladesh. The facility will provide compassionate end-of-life care to over 5,000 patients annually. It will also offer free cancer screenings to more than 10,000 individuals from rural and underserved areas. Additionally, over 500 healthcare professionals will be trained in best practices for palliative care, ensuring a future workforce equipped to provide high-quality care. A significant portion of the food consumed by patients will come from the facility's on-site farms, ensuring that nutrition remains an integral part of the healing process.

She expresses heartfelt thanks to BANCAT and everyone who stood by her during the most challenging time of her life, proving that compassion can truly transform lives.



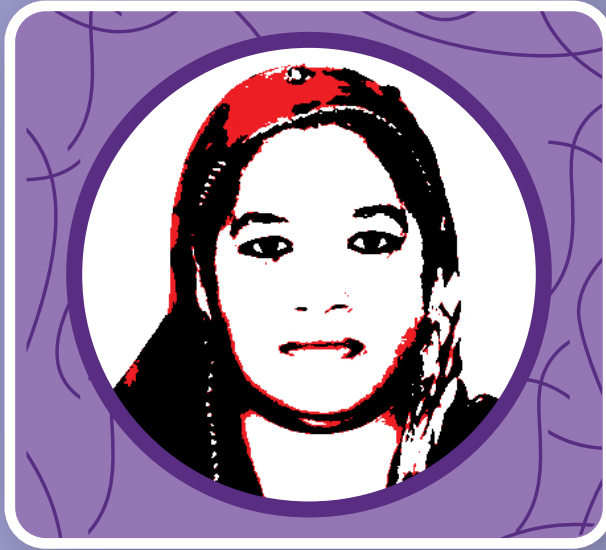
## I Nurnabi

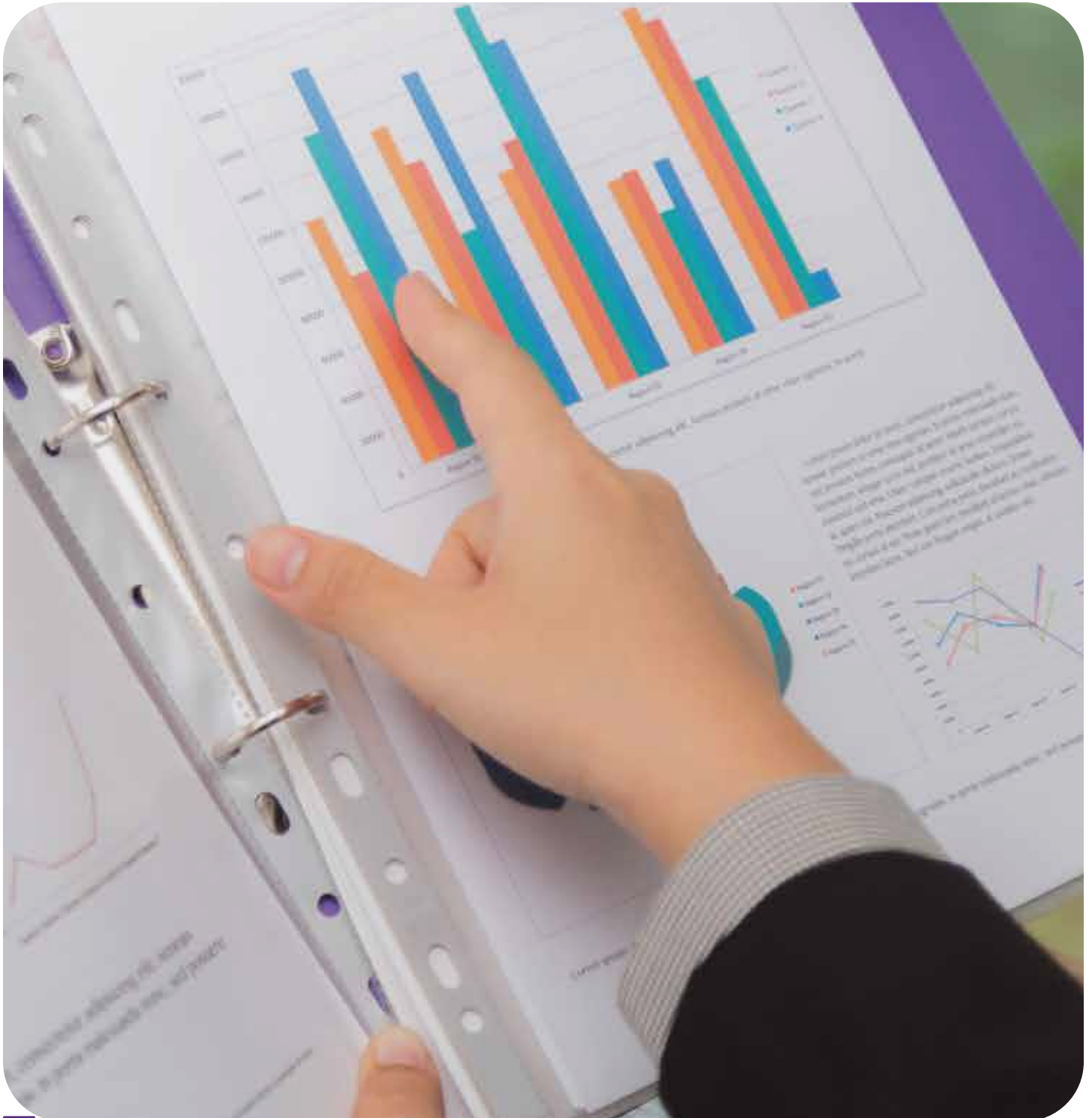

# Financial Report 2023

In 2023, BANCAT exhibited strong financial management, reflecting stability in asset growth and operational sustainability. The organization's total assets stood at BDT 9,714,836, comprising both non-current assets and current assets. A major component of non-current assets was Property, Plant & Equipment, which increased significantly to BDT 6,406,534, indicating infrastructure expansion to support patient care and operations. Current assets included Cash & Cash Equivalents, amounting to BDT 2,008,736, and Advance Deposits & Prepayments of BDT 1,299,566, ensuring liquidity for ongoing activities and future commitments. On the liability side, Accumulated Surplus Over Expenditure was BDT 9,450,436, reflecting sound financial health and prudent resource utilization. Accruals and Other Payables amounted to BDT 264,400, demonstrating minimal outstanding liabilities, thus maintaining operational efficiency. Despite a decrease in total assets compared to the previous year (BDT 12,892,878 in 2022), BANCAT maintained a positive financial position, ensuring sustainability in delivering cancer support services. This financial standing underscores BANCAT's dedication to transparency and efficient resource allocation, reinforcing its mission to support cancer patients through healthcare, awareness, and community welfare initiatives.

As dedicated caregivers of BANCAT, we are proud to publish our Annual Report for the second time this year, reflecting our ongoing commitment to providing care and support. This report highlights our achievements, initiatives, and the impact we have made throughout the Year of Care.
